OVERVIEW

For the Madison County Attorney's Office, Advent Diversion Manager has become an effective criminal diversion tool. It provides offense-specific education, allowing offenders to make amends conveniently. This approach helps address legal issues, protects young offenders' futures, and aims to break cycles of criminal behavior through education and rehabilitation.

CHALLENGE

The Madison County Attorney's Office processes 2,200 cases and 70 felonies weekly. While past diversion programs and alternative sentencing were largely ineffective, the agency sought a way to reduce workload, increase efficiency, and provide opportunities for rehabilitation.


SOLUTION


